School Performance Information

Contextual Information	<p>St Luke's Catholic Primary School, Woodvale, is a double stream primary school comprised of 463 students from Kindergarten to Year 6 serving the Woodvale Parish Community.</p> <p>The school is situated on a coastal plain, 7 kilometres from the Indian Ocean and 17 kilometres north of the City of Perth. The school is next to St Luke's Church and directly opposite Yellagonga Regional Park, a large section of bushland that is still home to mobs of western grey kangaroos.</p> <p>St Luke's is a Catholic school whose motto reflects the two books of St Luke's Gospel – "A people ever made new by the death and resurrection of Jesus". Our vision is to bring the gospel of Jesus, through faith and trust, to the school and the wider community by the building of caring relationships with one another. The staff, parents, children and members of the parish community endeavour to work together to promote the total development of the child. Every child's cultural background is valued and integrated into school life so that each child can grow to spiritual, personal and social maturity, in an environment of understanding, acceptance and happiness.</p> <p>The school caters for individuals by offering literacy support, specialist art programmes in Visual and Performing Arts as well as having a Telethon Speech and Hearing Unit on site. All of the senior students are encouraged to be leaders of the school and serve in the school's ministry groups.</p> <p>A welcoming school atmosphere, with a child friendly environment where students learn through play, is shown throughout the school. The environmental concept plan envisages a school environment that is a creative and inspiring place in which our students learn and grow.</p>

As part of the strategic approach, 2 key teachers in Numeracy were selected to develop teacher practise and confidence in Mathematics. Throughout 2017, Numeracy Leaders lead the community in a Numeracy Project based around the pedagogy of teaching numeracy through a consistent whole school approach. There was a continued focus on lifting Mathematics achievement through a whole-school approach to Numeracy Dedicated Time and inquiry-based learning. Coaching, shoulder-to-shoulder learning and observations took place to support this initiative.</p> <p><u>Digital Transformation Strategy</u> With the implementation of the Digital Technologies Curriculum, a continued emphasis was placed on the integration of effective teaching and learning using technology. 2017 saw the introduction of 1:1 devices in Year 4 and Year 6, along with the continued support of a Digital Learning Coordinator that worked alongside teachers in the use of technology within the classroom. Access to resources was increased with an emphasis placed on computational thinking in the Technologies Curriculum. This was paired with the redesign of the existing computer lab to reflect a more contemporary Makerspace, coined ‘The Learning Hub’. This space was designed for creative, critical thinking which promoted hands-on learning in an open, engaging space.</p> <p>There has been a continued focus on the implementation of the CEWA Leading Lights Strategy across the school in both the student, staff and community spaces.</p>
<p>Parent, Student and Teacher Satisfaction</p>	<p>Parent Satisfaction</p> <p>The parents at St Luke’s are always keen to help out in different ways throughout the school. Either through their attendance at P&F Meetings, organising the weekly pie/muffin days, busy bees, listening to reading, helping out in classes, school excursions, retreat days and other events organised by the P&F Committee. With an active P&F and parent involvement in the school, parent satisfaction is high at St Luke’s.</p>

	<p>Student Satisfaction</p> <p>St Luke's provides students with a wide range of learning opportunities. We have a continuing strong focus on our Performing Arts and Music programs in which all of our students are involved. Through ministry groups, students regularly discuss ways that they believe they can make a difference at St Luke's school. Recently, data was collected from the Staff, Student and Parent Survey to assist with strategic planning in 2018.</p>
